**Activity or Program Name:** ONTARIO’S OPIOID SAFE COMMUNITY/Leave Behind Narcan

**Activity or Program Description:** An ASO which includes Ontario Fire Department’s Leave Behind Narcan Program. The City of Ontario has experienced an increase in overdoses since early 2020. The implementation of leave behind Narcan allows members of the Ontario Fire Department to better serve the citizens by providing Narcan to patients who have previously overdosed as well as spread opioid awareness. The addition of the

4mg Narcan dose to the county protocol has been extremely successful. We are committed to being part of the solution by leaving Narcan behind to prevent future overdose.

### Activity#3

**Activity or Program Name:** Ontario Fentanyl Campaign

**Activity or Program Description:** Narcan kits have been strategically placed throughout the city in publicly accessible AED cabinets, ensuring residents can easily access them in the event of an emergency. In addition, Leave Behind Narcan kits are now carried on fire department vehicles and are distributed on-scene to friends and family members of individuals who has experienced an overdosed. As part of the Ontario Fentanyl Campaign, efforts are underway to educate and raise awareness among residents about the dangers of opioid abuse. This campaign includes targeted advertisements and school visits aimed at informing students about the ongoing opioid crisis. For training purposes, the Narcan trainer kits are used by the EMS bureau. These kits feature a practice applicator with a spring-loaded button that simulates administering a dose of Narcan. Trainer kits are reused during each educational session. The Leave Behind Narcan kits contain two actual doses of Narcan per box and are accompanied by the informational handouts. These materials provide family members with guidance and connect them to resources available throughout San Bernardino County.
