Activity or Program Name: Opioid Prevention Program

Activity or Program Description: The opioid use prevention activities funded with opioid settlement funds for FY 23-24 and going into FY 24-25 include identifying individuals in our county involved with or affected by the opioid crisis and arranging their video-recorded interviews with our

Brown Miller Communications media consultants as part of our multi-year fentanyl use prevention media campaigns. These videos were shown on several social media platforms in an effort to bring awareness to the dangers of fentanyl with the primary theme that just one pill can kill. Staff participated in a media campaign with Whitney Skillman, Communications Supervisor at the City of Fairfield’s City Manager’s Office, representing our Health Promotion & Community Wellness Bureau, Public Health and Behavioral Health, and shared our fentanyl prevention work alongside other community partners. The documentary style video will air on Fairfield’s Channel 26 soon.

Activity or Program Name: Literature Review and Data Collection - Construction Occupations & Overdose

Activity or Program Description: Given that coroner’s data presented to the Solano County Behavioral Health Advisory Board indicates that construction related occupations account for 33% of opioid overdose deaths in our County, staff is in the preliminary stages of doing a literature review and gathering needs assessment data regarding opioid/fentanyl use issues for those in construction trades. Staff will be working to ascertain if there are health education and prevention strategies that could reduce opioid use and overdose in those occupations. In addition, staff is collaborating with SCOE’s Johanna Nowak-Palmer, and our media consultants to enhance outreach efforts to middle school youth and to reach younger students in our anti-fentanyl use education and media awareness efforts.
