**Activity or Program Description:** Co-Responder program responds to calls for service where a person may be struggling with a mental health substance abuse. Upon contact the co-responders will assist the subject through their initial crisis determining whether the subject is placed on a

mental health hold or not. They provide resources to the family members and the subject involved. These resources may be connecting them to a case manager the client was already working with, connecting the client to a care provider within their medical coverage, referring them to a substance abuse programs. When managing a clients mental health early on it helps prevent them self-medicating. The Co- Responders use their training to ensure clients are provided for in the best manner possible.
