

Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) Performance Review Report

Kings County Program Review

Finding 1: Kings County did not identify in the assessment for the narrative analysis of the mental health needs of unserved, underserved/ inappropriately served, and fully served county residents who qualify for MHSA services in the adopted Fiscal Year (FY) 2023-26 Three-Year Program and Expenditure Plan (Plan), the number of children, Transitional Aged Youth (TAY), adult and older adults by: gender, race/ethnicity, and primary language. (California Code of Regulations, title 9, section 3650(a)(1)(A)).

Recommendation #1: The County must provide evidence of compliance by identifying in the assessment for the narrative analysis the number of children, TAY, adult, and older adults by gender, race/ethnicity, and primary language for FY 2023-26. The County provided the analysis based on age and not by gender, race/ethnicity, and primary language.

Finding 2: Kings County did not provide an estimate of the number of clients, in each age group, to be served in the Full-Service Partnership (FSP) category for each fiscal year of FY 2023-26 Plan. (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 9, § 3650(a)(3)).

Recommendation #2: The County must provide evidence of compliance for the estimated number of clients, in each age group, to be served in the FSP service category for each fiscal year of the Plan.
