Questions and Answers

State Plan Amendment (SPA) 22-0040 – Ground Emergency Medical Transport Quality Assurance Fee (GEMT QAF) Program

1. Question: How many Tribal GEMT providers are there?

DHCS Response: There are 4 Tribal GEMT providers currently participating in the GEMT QAF program.

State Plan Amendment (SPA) 22-0043 – Qualifying Community Based Mobile Crisis Intervention Services

- **2. Question:** Will clinics be required to provide 24/7 mobile crisis intervention services or will they be able to determine their own hours of operation? The concern is that the availability of staff for 24/7 services may be very challenging for some rural clinics who have difficulty filling other positions.
 - **DHCS Response:** Thank you for the feedback. The Department will share this information with the team. Currently, if approved the SPA will require that clinics provide mobile crisis intervention services 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- **3. Question:** How will clinics be reimbursed for mobile crisis intervention services? Will reimbursement be at the All-Inclusive Rate (AIR)?
 - **DHCS Response:** The reimbursement policy is currently under review with the Department. DHCS will release a Behavioral Health Information Notice (BHIN) clarifying the reimbursement policy for mobile crisis intervention services. The BHIN will be posted to DHCS' Mental Health & Substance Use Disorder Services and BHIN webpage.
- **4. Question:** Can clinics provide mobile crisis intervention services in any type of vehicle?
 - **DHCS Response:** Additional information regarding the minimum requirements and specifications will be released once the Department receives approval for the SPA from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). DHCS Response: There will be no change to reimbursement for dental services for Al/AN members enrolled in a Dental MCP for Tribal Health Programs as a result of these waiver amendments.
