

PROPOSED STATE PLAN AMENDMENT TO AMEND THE ALTERNATIVE BENEFIT PLAN (ABP)

This notice provides information of public interest about a proposed SPA by the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS). The proposed SPA 24-0038 will expand the list of providers who can supervise Community Health Workers (CHWs). DHCS also proposed technical edits to the ABP section of the State Plan to include recent changes to specialty mental health services and to clarify coverage of behavioral health treatment (BHT).

DHCS will submit SPA 24-0037 to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services to add pharmacies to the list of providers who can supervise CHWs. SPA 24-0038 proposed to make the make the same change in the ABP. Currently, licensed providers, hospitals, community-based organizations, local health jurisdictions, and clinics as defined in 42 CFR 440.90, may supervise CHWs.

In addition, SPA 24-0038 will make technical updates to the ABP to update the description of BHT to align with SPA 24-0031. These updates include clarifying that BHT services are available to any Medi-Cal member under 21 years of age for whom a physician or psychologist determines they are medical necessary and that a diagnosis for autism spectrum disorder is not required.

DHCS also seeks technical edits to align the ABP with updates made from the following SPAs for specialty mental health services:

- SPA 20-0006B, which added medication-assisted treatment, effective October 1, 2020.
- SPA 21-0051, which added peer support services and included peer support specialists as a distinct provider type, effective July 1, 2022.
- SPA 21-0058, which expanded substance use disorder treatment services as part of the Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery Services, effective January 1, 2022.

• SPA 22-0043, which added Qualifying Community-Based Mobile Crisis Intervention Services, effective January 1, 2023.

Additionally, this notice provides information of public interest with respect to Section 440.386 of Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), which requires Medicaid states to publish a public notice to solicit public input regarding the amendment to the Medi-Cal ABP. DHCS provides a comprehensive set of services under the Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic, and Treatment (EPSDT) benefit for individuals under 21 years of age, as described by 42 CFR 440.345. DHCS complied with the provisions of Section 5006 (e) of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009; DHCS published a tribal notice on August 23, 2024, and held a tribal webinar on August 29, 2024.

SPA 24-0038 is subject to approval by CMS.
