NOTICE OF PROPOSED EMERGENCY REGULATORY ACTION READOPTION OF DRUG MEDI-CAL PROGRAM INTEGRITY, DHCS-14-006E

Pursuant to Government Code Section 11346.1(a)(2), notice is hereby given that the Department of Health Care Services (Department) proposes to readopt emergency regulations that amend Title 22, California Code of Regulations (CCR), Division 3, Section 51341.1. This notice is a statement of intent to readopt the emergency regulations as previously filed. A copy of the text of the proposed emergency regulations and the Finding of Emergency are enclosed. In accordance with Title 1, CCR, Section 52, readoption of emergency regulations pursuant to Government Code Section 11346.1(h) requires sending a notice of proposed regulatory action pursuant to Government Code Section 11346.1(a)(2).

Government Code Section 11346.1(a)(2) requires that, at least five (5) working days prior to submission of the proposed emergency action to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL), the adopting agency provide a notice of the proposed emergency action to every person who has filed a request for notice of regulatory action with the agency. After submission of the proposed emergency to the OAL, the OAL shall allow interested persons five (5) calendar days to submit comments on the proposed emergency action as set forth in Government Code Section 11349.6.

If approved, the OAL will file the regulations with the Secretary of State and the emergency regulations will be effective for 180 days. During the 180 day effective period, the Department will complete the rulemaking process.
