This rulemaking by the Department of Health Care Services amends sections in Title 22 of the California Code of Regulations regarding hospice benefits under the Medi-Cal program for certified terminally ill beneficiaries. This action clearly specifies the scope and duration of hospice care for Medi-Cal beneficiaries and that children under hospice care who are under the age of 21 are allowed curative care. With these changes, the Medi-Cal provisions will be consistent with federal law and the Medicare program.

OAL approves this regulatory action pursuant to section 11349.3 of the Government Code. This regulatory action becomes effective on 4/1/2016.

- (1) Amend Section 51180 as follows:
- § 51180. Hospice Care.
- (a) Hospice care means the provision of palliative and supportive items and services described below to a terminally ill individual as defined in Section 51180.2, who has voluntarily elected to receive such care in lieu of curative treatment related to the terminal condition, by a hospice provider or by others under arrangements made by a hospice provider:
  - (1) Nursing se[begin underline]r[end underline]vices;
  - (2) Physical or occupational therapy, or speech-language pathology;
  - (3) Medical social services under the direction of a physician;
  - (4) Home health aide and homemaker services;
  - (5) Medical supplies and appliances;
  - (6) Drugs and biologicals;
  - (7) Physician services;
  - (8) Short-term inpatient care;
  - (9) Counseling, including bereavement, dietary and spiritual counseling;
- (10) Any other item or service for which payment may otherwise be made under the Medi-Cal Program.

[begin underline](b) Hospice care for a child, under the age of 21, shall also include
the items and services specified in subsection (a) for care related to curative
treatment.[end underline]

(2) Amend Section 51349 as follows:

§ 51349. Hospice Care.

Subsections (a) through (c) - No Changes

- (d) An individual who elects to receive hospice care, or that individual's representative as defined in Section 51180. [begin strikeout]3[end strikeout] [begin underline]7[end underline] must file an election statement with the hospice providing the care. The election statement shall include:
  - (1) Identification of the hospice.
  - (2) The individual's or representative's acknowledgement that:
- (A) [begin strikeout]He or she has full understanding that the h[end strikeout] [begin underline]H[end underline]ospice care [begin underline]provided to adults shall[end underline] [begin strikeout]given as it relates to the individual's terminal illness will[end strikeout] be palliative rather than curative in nature[begin underline], or[end underline] [begin strikeout]-[end strikeout]
- (B) [begin underline]Hospice care provided to a child, under the age of 21, may be palliative and curative at the discretion of the treating physician.[end underline]

[begin strikeout](B)[end strikeout] [begin underline](C)[end underline] [begin underline]For adults,[end underline] [begin underline]c[end underline][begin strikeout]C[end strikeout]ertain Medi-Cal benefits as specified in subsection (f) are waived by the election.

- (3) The effective date of the election.
- (4) The signature of the individual or representative.

- (e) Elections[begin underline], as specified under subsection (d),[end underline] may be made for up to two periods of 90 days each[begin strikeout], one subsequent period of 30 days, and one 180-day extension of the 30-day period. Hospice services shall not be covered beyond 390 days.[end strikeout] [begin underline] and for an unlimited number of subsequent periods of 60 days each.[end underline]
- (1) Payment shall be made for hospice care on behalf of an individual who voluntarily elects such care only during the two periods of 90 days each [begin strikeout] and one-subsequent period of 30 days and any subsequent extension[end strikeout] [begin underline] and during the unlimited number of subsequent periods of 60 days each[end underline] during the individual's lifetime.
- (2) An election period shall be considered to continue through the initial election period and through subsequent election periods as long as the hospice provider agrees to renew the election and as long as the individual:
  - (A) Remains in the care of the hospice; and
  - (B) Does not revoke the election.
- (3) An individual's voluntary election may be revoked or modified at any time. To revoke the election of hospice care, the individual or representative must file a statement with the hospice that includes the following information:
- (A) A signed statement that the individual or representative revokes the individual election for Medi-Cal coverage for the remainder of the election period.
- (B) The effective date, which may not be earlier than the date the revocation is made.

(4) Revocation shall constitute a waiver of the right to hospice care during the remainder of the current 90 or [begin strikeout]30-[end strikeout] [begin underline]subsequent 60[end underline]-day election period[begin underline]s[end underline] [begin strikeout]plus any extension[end strikeout].
