ACTING REGULATIONS COORDINATORAPPEL: I'm Steve Appel, Acting Regulations Coordinator with the California Department of Mental Health. Seated beside is John Lessley, Chief, State Level Program Administration.

It is exactly 1:02 p.m. on Wednesday, April21, 2010 and we are gathered here today in the auditorium atthe Department of Water Resources located at 1416 Ninth Street in Sacramento, California in order to receive public comments on a proposed rulemaking action by the Department of Mental Health.

The subject of this public hearing is theproposed amendment to Section 1810.203.5, Appeal, and adoption of Section 1850.350, to Title 9 of the California Code of Regulations, Division 1, Chapter 11, Articles 2 and 3, regarding the Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment Appeal Process.

The amendment to Section 1810.203.5 is the addition of subdivision (d), expanding the definition of "appeal" to include MHP and/or MHP subcontractor's request for a review of the client record review findings.

Section 1850.350 is adopted to identify the progressive appeal process that is available to the MHPs and MHPsubcontractors. It provides standards, protocols and

Under the rulemaking provisions of the California Administrative Procedure Act, the APA, this is the time and place set for the allowance of oral public comments to the Department of Mental Health's proposed regulations noticeof which has previously been both published and sent by U.S. Mail and email to interested parties.

Written comments may continue to be submitted to the Department of Mental Health up until 5:00 o'clockp.m. today, although this public hearing may conclude beforesuch time if everyone who wishes to offer oral comments hashad the opportunity to do so before such time.

This is a quasi-legislative hearing, which means the Department of Mental Health carries out a rulemaking function that is delegated to it by the Legislature.

Persons presenting oral comments at thishearing will not be sworn in. The Department will not be engaging in a dialogue regarding the merits of the proposed regulation with those that wish to make public comments today.

We will take under submission all written and oral statements submitted or made during this hearing.

We will not be responding to your comments at this hearing. However, we reserve the opportunity to ask

questions at today's hearing in order to clarifyyour comments if necessary.

We will respond to these comments in writingin the final statement of reasons.

This entire APA rulemaking hearing willbe recorded by a certified shorthandreporter.
