SUBJECT: SENATE BILL (SB) 1131 - UPDATES TO THE SAFE AT HOME

PROGRAM (SAH)

The purpose of this Medi-Cal Eligibility Division Information Letter (MEDIL) is to inform counties that Senate Bill (SB) 1131 (Chapter 3.2, Statutes of 2022) was signed into law on September 26, 2022, which expands the address confidentiality program to include individuals who face violence, harassment, or threats of violence from the public because of their work for a public entity. Individuals can also be defined as health care providers, public health officers and public health workers, election workers, school board members, and other city, county, and state government employees.

As outlined in All County Welfare Directors Letter (<u>ACWDL</u>) 14-34, the Secretary of State implemented the confidential SAH program on July 1, 1999 to help victims or survivors of domestic violence or stalking to remain safe from an abusive situation. SB 1131 expands the current program to include other individuals who face threats of violence or violence or harassment from the public because of their work for a public entity. The bill would require an individual seeking to make their address confidential under these provisions to complete the application in person at a community-based assistance program designated by the Secretary of State. The bill would require the application process to include a requirement that the applicant meet with a counselor and receive orientation information about the program.
