SUBJECT: APPROPRIATE USES FOR SYSM

The purpose of this letter is to provide counties with some general guidelines regarding the appropriate use of the Electronic Mail System (SYSM).

Several county administrators have informed us that SYSM is, at times, being used inappropriately by counties for communications not relating to MEDS activities. The use of SYSM for non-MEDS related messages has a detrimental effect on other SYSM users. The use of SYSM for non-MEDS related messages can overload the system, thereby causing unnecessary delays for other SYSM users. Also, there is a cost for every SYSM message sent and/or printed. The Department of Health Services therefore asks that SYSM be used only for its original purpose, to communicate MEDS system information quickly and efficiently.

Appropriate county uses for SYSM could include sending and receiving MEDS Network related questions/information between MEDS/Medi-Cal Policy Liaisons and counties; intercounty communications for resolving MEDS Network problems (i.e. resolving Social Security Number discrepancies, asking another county to discontinue Food Stamps, etc.); sending and receiving information between the Department of Health Service's Data Guidance Unit and the counties (i.e. communicating information on batch input, non-receipt of listings, reconciliation schedules, system problems, etc.).

Inappropriate uses of SYSM include the sending of personal
messages, job announcements, etc.
