SUBJECT: IRCA/OBRA IMPLEMENTATION WORKSHOPS

We expect that the Governor will sign SB 175, a bill passed by the Legislature that would conform state law to the Medicaid-related provisions of the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986 (IRCA) and the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1986 (OBRA). In anticipation of enactment of SB 175, the Medi-Cal Eligibility Branch will hold five one-day workshops throughout the State. We will discuss policy and systems aspects of SB 175 including the Systematic Alien Verification of Entitlements (SAVE) program.
