STRATEGIES TO ADDRESS IDENTIFIED HOUSING AND SERVICE GAPS IN THE COUNTY
<p>County Narrative Description (200-word limit)</p> <p>Anthem Blue Cross, California Health & Wellness, and Kaiser Permanente partnered with the Central Sierra CoC lead agency, Amador-Tuolumne Community Action Agency (ATCAA) to develop the HHIP County LHP for Amador County. Medi-Cal MCP strategies to address identified housing and service gaps align with the CoC's "Strategic Action Plan to Prevent and End Homelessness" to reduce homelessness in Amador, Calaveras, Mariposa, and Tuolumne counties, focused on strengthening administrative capacity, increasing placements into permanent housing, and preventing and diverting persons from homelessness, and HHAP 3 strategies on increasing exits from homelessness, reducing returns to homelessness, and increasing placements from street outreach.</p> <p>The MCPs are aligning with broader community strategies and will specifically focus on 1) data sharing/HMIS access; 2) integration with CES; 3) increasing provider capacity such as street medicine or other approaches to increase healthcare access to those living unsheltered; 4) addressing health disparities; and 5) ensuring strong implementation of CalAIM ECM benefit and CS housing services and integration within the homeless response system.</p> <p>Anthem, California Health & Wellness, and Kaiser Permanente will collaborate with ATCAA and the CoC throughout the HHIP program to implement MCP strategies, meet program measures, and create robust housing and healthcare partnerships in Amador County.</p>
