STRATEGIES TO ADDRESS IDENTIFIED HOUSING AND SERVICE GAPS IN THE COUNTY
County Narrative Description (200-word limit)

Anthem Blue Cross and California Health & Wellness are committed to collaborating to reduce and prevent homelessness in Mono County and enhance the connection of Medi-Cal members to housing services. To build consensus around our strategies and gain community input for our Housing and Homelessness Incentive Program (HHIP) County Local Homelessness Plan, MCPs jointly met with members of Eastern Sierra CoC, the local CoC, and presented proposed strategies at CoC meetings. This allowed us to engage multiple community stakeholders (i.e. government representatives, social service and housing agencies, and community providers) and ensure alignment with Homeless Housing, Assistance, and Prevention Round 3 (HHAP-3) strategies.

Our countywide strategies include: 1) improve data sharing capabilities with Homeless Management Information System (HMIS); 2) integrate with the Coordinated Entry System (CES); 3) develop partnerships that address disparities and inequities in housing-related service delivery (i.e. an integrated and robust street medicine model); and 4) bolster ongoing CalAIM Community Supports and ECM initiatives to better identify and serve individuals experiencing homelessness. MCPs and Eastern Sierra CoC will work together to implement HHIP strategies, meet program measures, and create the capacity and partnerships to make progress toward racial equity and addressing homelessness and housing insecurity in Mono County.
