STRATEGIES TO ADDRESS IDENTIFIED HOUSING AND SERVICE GAPS IN THE COUNTY
County Narrative Description (200-word limit)
<p>Anthem Blue Cross and California Health & Wellness partnered with the Tehama County CoC and Empower Tehama (CoC Lead Agency) to develop the HHIP County LHP for Tehama County. Medi-Cal managed care plan (MCP) strategies to address identified housing and service gaps align with the CoC's "10-Year Plan to End Homelessness" in Tehama County focused on street outreach, temporary housing, permanent supportive housing, and permanent affordable housing. Additionally, the LHP is aligned with HHAP 3 strategies focused on community engagement, housing placements/retention, multi-family housing, and case management/supportive services.</p> <p>MCPs are aligning with broader community strategies, HHIP strategies, and will focus on 1) data sharing/HMIS access; 2) integration with the CES; 3) partnerships with street medicine programs; 4) addressing health disparities; and 5) ensuring strong implementation of CalAIM ECM and CS housing services. Lastly, based on CoC and the County immediate gaps, there is a desire among partners to support system capacity needs and programs serving unsheltered homelessness and prevention services.</p> <p>Anthem and California Health & Wellness will collaborate with Tehama County CoC and Empower Tehama throughout the HHIP program to implement MCP strategies, meet HHIP program measures, and create robust housing and healthcare partnerships that address homelessness in Tehama County.</p>
